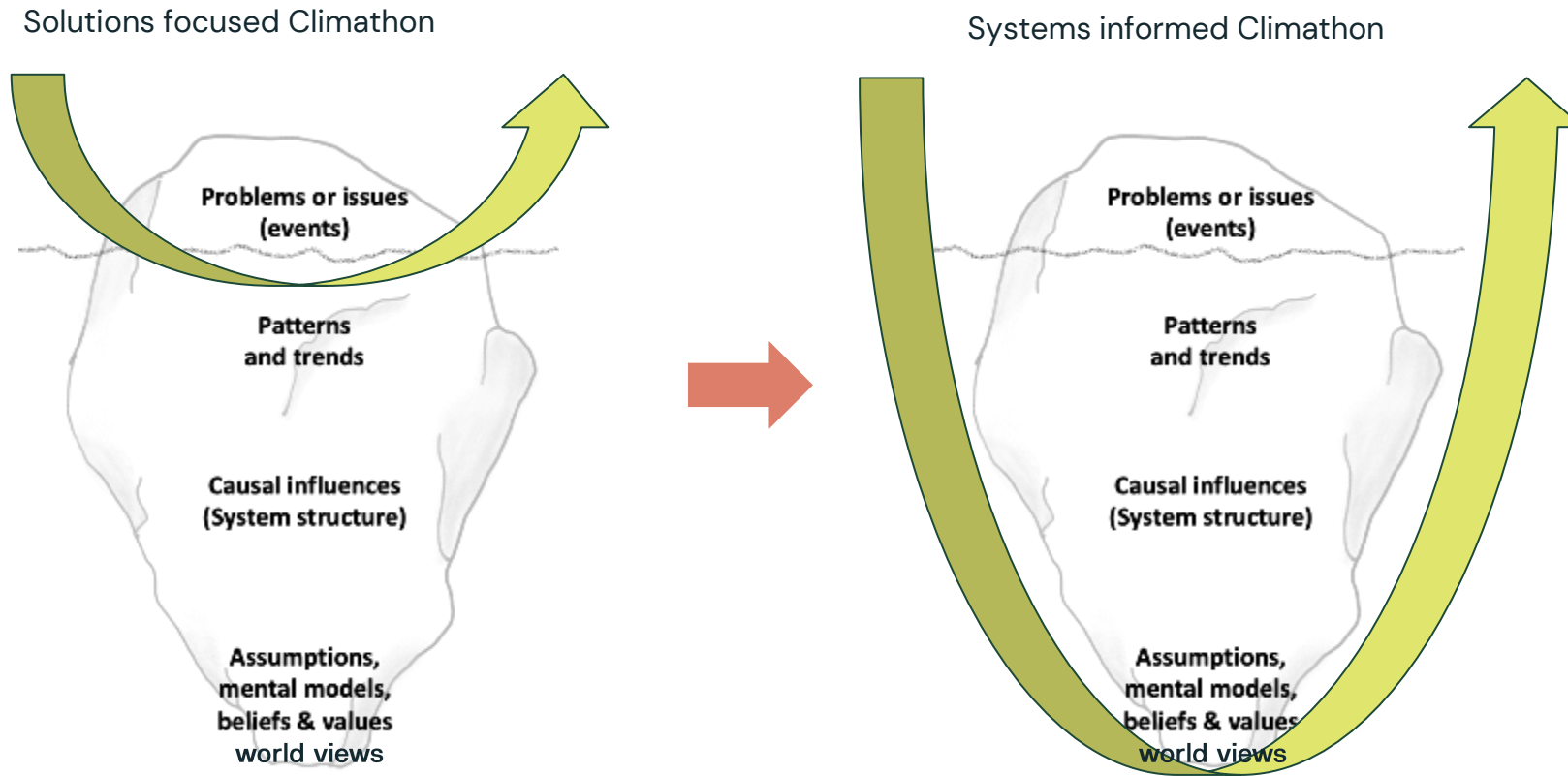
# Climathon – A maturity journey

THEORY

	Solutions focused Climathon 	<b>Systems informed Climathon</b> 	Systemic Climathon Labs 
Focus	Climate Startups, Technical Innovation, Symptom driven approach, creates financial value. Pushing solutions to the market	Complex Challenges and appropriate climate action, Root cause driven approach (Iceberg Model), creates stakeholder value and social value. Citizens viewpoints are incorporated in solution creation	Emergent climate action response from different sub-systems aiming to address the complex root causes of climate change, creates systemic value (7 community capitals, including financial capital). Co-creating solutions with community of citizens experiencing root causes
Mindset	Competition - Winner takes it all, economic growth tops all, technological centrality	Widening the perspective towards collaborative interventions, ecosystem approach	Holistic, emergent, collaborative ecosystem approach
Participants	Driven by individual success and desire for financial merits	Representing different viewpoints, values & mental models	Representing different viewpoints, values & mental models
Role of host	Project Management	Stakeholder and citizen relationship management	Holding the frame between lab core team and stakeholder collaboration
Type of facilitation	Solely design thinking innovation process	Facilitating different stakeholders to a common goal (collaborative, emergent and reflective, sense making, divergence, groan zone, convergence)	Facilitation expertise depends on each lab session (e.g. System thinking facilitation followed by collaborative Solutions facilitation)
Stakeholder involvement	Limited to challenge provider, mainly from for profit organisation, hoping for a direct benefit, transactional relationship	Widening to municipal organisations, NGO, and citizens	Committed core team + wide variety of stakeholders committed across the labs, experts are involved depending on lab session. Long term partnerships
Key tools	Business Model Canvas, narrow problem statement definition, Design Sprints	System Thinking Frameworks, Visioning, Feedback Loops, Leverage Points, Sense Making Frameworks, creative problem solving and iterative prototyping & testing	Tools depend on lab session including all tools covered in systems informed climathon. Social labs approach.
Frequency	Once a year, and/or one off	Once a year, and/or one off	Series of sessions spanning across 12 - 24 month
